We are aware that a number of parents who bring their children to school in cars, park on **Frances Brady Way**. Please be aware that this area is now under a parking restriction. Local residents themselves have to apply for parking permits. This was put in place as a direct consequence of how some people were choosing to park. There are issues with residents' drives being obstructed and cars speeding through the streets of the estate before and after school pick up and drop off, putting the safety of our children and others at risk.

We ask you to act respectfully towards our neighbours and think carefully about where and how you leave your car. We continue to support the local council, our local councillors and the police to ensure that safety is maintained at all times. Our children's safety, as well as that of the community, is extremely important to us all.



East Hull Brass Band Project
