This is an exciting time for our schools and a great opportunity for us to further strengthen our partnership as a family of schools and formalise the strong relationships that already exist between us.

As a partnership, our strength lies in a common purpose: high aspirations, moral values, care and support; yet celebrates our individual uniqueness. As a trust, we will drive these aims further and faster for the benefit of our pupils and our communities.

We are currently consulting on our proposals with students, parents, staff, governors and the wider community and as a key stakeholder in this decision we want to give you every opportunity to have your voice heard.
